Regular Board Meeting – June 21, 2023 - Windsor Jr/Sr High School Library

1. Call to Order, Roll Call President Michelle Schultz called the meeting to order at 6:31pm.

The following were present: Matt Greuel, Christie Storm, Michelle Schultz, Karen Pfeiffer, Stacy Cole, Albert Shafer, Josh Cline. Administrator Erik Van Hoveln and Bart Wiedman were also present.

a. Superintendent Report

Mr. Van Hoveln reported:

b. Principal Report

Mr. Wiedman reported:

1. Update on the School Improvement Plan for the 2022-23 School Year on MAP Testing = Remember the goals stayed the same at 60% from 21-22 to 22-23. We were wanting to see consistency from year to year without the traditional dip from the past.
 - Goal #1 – WJHS students showing normative growth will increase to 60% of students in **MATH** from the fall to the spring.
 - 21-22 School Year was 64% growth (36 to 42 Percentile)
 - 22-23 School Year was 83.5% growth (35 to 38 Percentile)
 - 22-23 School Year = 7th Grade
 - 95% Student showed growth (30 to 36 Percentile)
 - Class Average RIT: 223.1
 - Your grade 7 students have scores below the national average (227).
 - 22-23 School Year = 8th Grade
 - 72% Students showed growth (40 to 40 Percentile) = 1 Even, 2 dropped 1, 1 dropped 2, 2 dropped 3, 1 dropped 4

- Class Average RIT: 227
 - Your grade 8 students have scores below the national average (230).
- Positive Outcome for pushing Ms. Genta into a subject that she was qualified, but had never taught. For $\frac{3}{4}$ of the year, the 8th grade had no upper math (Algebra). Also, all students 7th grade and then 8th grade students were grouped into 1 class, making for a larger class size. When scores came in from the winter test we were able to take the top 8 scorers and get them into an online APEX program to get them ready for geometry as a Freshman.
- Goal #2 – WJHS students showing normative growth will increase to 60% of students in **Reading** from the fall to the spring.
 - **21-22 School Year** was 63% growth (39 to 49 Percentile)
 - **22-23 School Year** was 89% growth (32 to 51 Percentile)
 - **22-23 School Year = 7th Grade**
 - 95% Showed Growth (23 to 51 Percentile)
 - Class Average RIT: 218.5
 - Your grade 7 students have scores above the national average (218).
 - **22-23 School Year = 8th Grade**
 - 83% Showed Growth (41 – 51 Percentile)
 - Class Average RIT: 220.8
 - Your grade 8 students have scores below the national average (222), but Throw out the 1 student that didn't try and dropped 22 points = **222.3 - Make National Average.**
- Positive Outcome showing that our writing curriculum and daily instruction had an impact, co-teaching worked, and using text reading in science and social studies.
- 3rd test that didn't have a goal in the SIP plan was in Language for ELA
 - 7th Grade
 - 17/20 (85%) = Showed growth
 - Class Average RIT: 212.7
 - Your grade 7 students have scores below the national average (216).
 - Median Percentile: 33
 - 8th Grade
 - 22/24 (91.6%) = Showed Growth

- Class Average RIT: 221.7
 - Your grade 8 students have scores above the national average (219).
 - Median Percentile: 56
- Incentive Days at the end of the year, plus working on rapid testing in the winter was huge help
2. SAT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9
- **WHS Juniors** SAT total score was a 925 – State is 965 – CCRI 1080 (WHS had 3)
 - WHS English score was a 474 – State 490 – CCRI 540 (WHS had 6)
 - 9/20 above 490
 - WHS Math score was a 450 – State 476 – CCRI 540 (WHS had 2)
 - 6/20 was above 476
 - **WHS Sophomores** PSAT Total Score was an 850 – State is 907
 - WHS English score was a 445 – State is 459
 - 3/16 above 540 & 7/16 above 459
 - WHS Math score was 405 – State is 448
 - 0/16 above 540 & 5/16 above 448
 - **WHS Freshmen** PSAT total score was a 799 – State is 873
 - WHS English Score was a 412 – State is 441
 - 2/28 above 540 & 6/28 above 441
 - WHS Math Score was a 388 – State is 434
 - 0/28 above 540 & 7/28 above 434

We can direct scores and make better goals with the HS taking this test twice a year instead of once in the Spring. This was a change by the School Leadership team.
